in the face. Around 130-200 the police forced us into our house and would not let us stand on our porch. Throughout the rest of the night people were banging on our door to let them in because they were sprayed or they needed somewhere to stay. The commotion did not die down until 4am. I was astonished by what I saw Friday night. It was absurd that the law enforcement, people who are supposed to protect us, were so unnecessarily harsh to students. The next morning there was still pepper spray in the air, and on the outside of houses. The next afternoon I touched the pepper spray and touched my lip by an accident. The pepper spray caused an allergic reaction, and my lips swelled up. I had to go to the hospital because benadryl was not helping the swelling.
